



Camper Code of Conduct

Please read and sign the following Camper Code of Conduct. Your signature will acknowledge that you have read and understand Camp Blue Hawk's regulations, guidelines and expectations while at camp.

Medications

1. All medicines will be kept at the Infirmary, except emergency medications, which will be kept in counselor backpacks.

Rules and Guidelines

1. Life jackets are to be worn at all times when in or on the lake water. At all other times, lifeguards are in charge at the swimming area, and what they say goes!
2. Pocket knives or other weapons are prohibited at camp.
3. Alcohol, illegal drugs and smoking are prohibited at camp.
4. Cell phones and other electronic items (iPods, DVD players, MP3 players, etc.) are not permitted at camp.
5. Campers will never leave the camp facilities unsupervised. They must stay with their counselors in their teams.
6. The University of Oklahoma, Harold Hamm Diabetes Center, Camp Blue Hawk, and Central Christian Camp and Conference Center will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.
7. Campers are not allowed to be in the cabins without a counselor - supervision means within the line of sight of counselors.
8. Boy cabins are for boys. Girl cabins are for girls. No exceptions. If campers are caught in a cabin with a camper of the opposite sex, they will be sent home.

Behavior

1. Campers must respect the rights of others. There will be NO Physical Abuse: such as hitting, fighting, shaking, slapping, hazing, excessive or cruel horseplay. NO Verbal Abuse: such as ragging, humiliating, degrading, threatening, cussing, profanity, cruel jokes, or inappropriate pranks. NO Mental Abuse: such as hazing, cliques, singling out other campers.
2. Inappropriate contact, inappropriate touching, and public display of affection of any kind is prohibited.
3. Campers are not allowed to go through or tamper with other campers' things. If it isn't yours, don't touch it or move it.
4. Although cabin camaraderie is to be expected, campers should make every effort to include all campers that want to be part of a group. This is a time to develop new friends and relationships. Exclusive cliques will not be tolerated.
5. Campers will treat others of all ethnic, religious, and cultural backgrounds with respect and consideration.
6. Campers will be sensitive to the difference and abilities of other campers.
7. Campers are prepared and willing to meet personal daily needs, including blood glucose testing and treatment.
8. Campers will maintain a positive attitude of respect, loyalty, patience, honesty, courtesy, tact, and maturity.

9. Campers are expected to participate in all camp activities and individual cabin activities. No camper may exclude himself or herself from any planned camp activity unless directed by the Camp Program Manager or Medical Director.
10. Campers are expected to follow all instructions given to them by any staff member.
11. Campers will protect and respect all property belonging to camp facilities, staff and other campers.
12. Campers are not allowed to take photos of other campers or staff without their consent.
13. Once all campers are in the cabin and the cabin is secured for the evening, no camper is allowed to leave. If campers are caught sneaking out of the cabin, they will be sent home.
